Commute to Work for FREE with the Caltrain Go Pass


Eligible employees of Stanford Medicine can enjoy unlimited, fare-free rides on Caltrain with no restrictions.



Learn how you can start commuting with Caltrain for **FREE**

As gas prices are rising, commuting becomes more appealing especially when Caltrain is an easy, efficient, and environmentally friendly option! As part of Stanford Medicine's Clipper card benefit, eligible Stanford Medicine employees can ride the Caltrain for free with the Caltrain Go Pass.

There are Caltrain stations conveniently located all the way from Gilroy to San Francisco!



Simply scan your free Stanford Medicine Clipper card (pre-loaded with a Caltrain Go Pass) at a Caltrain station, then sit back and relax. Once you've arrived at the Palo Alto Caltrain Station, you can hop onto one of these three convenient staff shuttles to ride to the Stanford Medicine Palo Alto campus:

• Line MC

- The Medical Center (MC) shuttle travels between the Palo Alto Transit Center, Stanford Health Care, and Lucile Packard Children's Hospital. Perfect for staff commuting to Lucile Packard Children's Hospital, Blake Wilbur Drive, Welch Road properties, and 500 Pasteur.
- Operating hours: 5:00 A.M. to 9:00 P.M.

• Line X

- The Line X shuttle travels between the Palo Alto Transit Center and 300 Pasteur (via Quarry Road Extension). In the mornings, the X Express provides quick direct service to the 300 Pasteur Emergency Department!
- o Operating hours: 5:53 A.M. to 6:59 P.M.

• Line Y

- The Line Y shuttle travels between 300 Pasteur (via Quarry Road Extension) and the Palo Alto Transit Center. In the afternoons, the Y Express provides quick direct service from the 300 Pasteur Emergency Department to Caltrain!
- Operating hours: 6:39 A.M. to 6:59 P.M.

Stanford Medicine Clipper cards come pre-loaded with a free annual Caltrain Go Pass and a Santa Clara Valley Transportation Authority (VTA) SmartPass. Staff can also add funds <u>using pre-tax dollars</u> to use on all other major Bay Area transit systems such as the Bay Area Rapid Transit (BART), Muni, Golden Gate Transit, and more.

New Electric Vehicle Charging and Rolling Gate at the Center for Academic Medicine Garage

The Center for Academic Medicine (CAM) garage now offers 8 electric vehicle (EV) charging stations and a new rolling gate for secured access outside of designated hours.




The EV charging stations are located on level P1 of the CAM garage

Exciting news!

The Center for Academic Medicine (CAM) garage, located at 453 Quarry Road, now features 8 electric vehicle (EV) charging ports located on level P1 of the garage.

To use the EV charging at the CAM garage, it's recommended to have an active parking permit or a paid visitor parking pass. Once fully charged, it's advised to relocate your vehicle to an appropriate commuter (or visitor) parking spot.

The CAM garage offers 'A' permit parking on levels 1 and 2, and 'C' permit parking on levels 2 and 3.



A rolling gate was also recently installed at the entrance of the CAM Garage and is expected to become operational in the near future. Once operational, the gate will remain open from 5 AM to 8 PM. To access the garage outside of these hours, a Stanford Medicine or Stanford University ID badge will need to be scanned by the card reader at the garage entry gate.
