Simplify Your Parking Experience With an 'A' Parking Permit

Take advantage of the new 'A' parking permit eligibility to park at the most convenient parking locations near the Stanford Medicine Palo Alto hospital campus.

Exciting news!

The 'A' parking permit is now available for all Stanford Health Care (SHC) and Lucile Packard Children's Hospital (LPCH) employees, regardless of hire date.


With an 'A' parking permit, you have the ability to park at prime parking locations near the Stanford Medicine Palo Alto hospital campus, which include:

• Center for Academic Medicine (CAM) Garage

- Address: 453 Quarry Road, Palo Alto, CA 94304
- The CAM garage is mostly 'A' permit parking only.
- Level 2 of the CAM garage has been updated to include more 'A' parking permit stalls.

• Roth Way Garage

- Address: 355 Roth Way, Stanford, CA 94304
- The Roth Way Garage averages 200+ open 'A' parking permit stalls per day!
- The parking facility is minutes away from 300 Pasteur and the Lucile Packard Children's Hospital.

'A' parking permit rates:

- Monthly parking permit rate: \$133
- Daily parking permit rate: \$19

If you wish to change to a monthly 'A' parking permit, it is highly recommended that you make this change during the transition between months, such as on September 30 or October 1. This will ensure you will not have to pay twice for the same month.

If you ever want to switch back to your original permit at a later date, you always can, but it is recommended to do so during the transition between months as mentioned above.

PURCHASE AN 'A' PARKING PERMIT TODAY

Need a Ride Late at Night? The Evening Parking Shuttle (EPS) Has Got You Covered!

The Evening Parking Shuttle is a convenient and free on-demand shuttle option for staff who leave work after 9:00 PM.



Transportation Services provides this service for swing and night shift hospital workers, whose shifts may end outside of regular shuttle service hours.

The EPS is a free on-demand service that transports hospital staff from the 500 Pasteur Transportation Lounge, Lucile Packard Children's Hospital Main Lobby, and 875 Blake Wilbur to different parking locations around campus and the Palo Alto Transit Center.

The late-night shuttle is available on demand from 9:00 PM to 4:00 AM.

Between 4:00 AM - 5:00 AM, the EPS will run every 10 minutes from Hoover Pavilion Garage to Lucile Packard Children's Hospital Main Lobby and the 500 Pasteur Transportation Lounge.

Transportation Services has recently added an extra vehicle for the EPS, which will help provide quicker response times for staff!

The Santa Clara Park & Ride lot (near Levi Stadium) and the Campbell Park & Ride lot (formerly the old Fry's Electronics lot) provide free parking and transportation for staff at the Stanford Medicine Palo Alto hospital campus. Enjoy easy, free parking and a direct shuttle ride that connects directly to Lucile Packard Children's Hospital and 500 Pasteur!

Commuting from the East Bay?

East Bay staff can choose to park for free at the Ardenwood Park & Ride lot (Ardenwood Blvd. & Hwy. 84) and the Wells Fargo Park & Ride lot (3440 Walnut Avenue) - both located in Fremont. These lots connect with transbay commuter busses to the Stanford Medicine Palo Alto hospital campus and the Stanford University campus.
