University Transitioning to 24/7 Parking Enforcement

Hospital Lots & Garages are not Affected



No Change to Hospital Lots & Garages

If you need to park after-hours or on weekends, the best option for hospital staff is to park in one of the following areas, which are not affected by this change:

- **S-3: 500P Pasteur Staff Garage (PSG)**: Enforced Monday Friday, 6am 4pm. Attendant will check for permit at garage entry starting at 4am
- S-9: Hoover Pavilion Garage: Enforced Monday Friday, 6am 4pm
- L-1A: Hoover Pavilion North Surface Lot (Lot 1A): Enforced Monday -Friday, 6am - 4pm
- L-9J: J Lot: Authorized badge access only, enforced 24/7
- **S-4: Pasteur Visitor Garage**: Complimentary evening & weekend badge access available to swing and night shift staff, enforced 24/7

If you are already parking in one of the above areas after-hours or on weekends, **no action is required.**

Night and Weekend Parking Enforcement in Stanford University Parking Lots & Garages Starts Monday, November 2nd, 2020

As of Monday, November 2, 2020, parking in Stanford University lots and garages will be enforced 24 hours a day, 7 days a week. Current valid University parking permits ('A', 'C', 'Z', or Motorcycle) will be valid 24/7 at no additional charge, and **no action is required for current permit holders.**

Hospital staff without a current University parking permit who need to park on campus after 4pm on weekdays or any time on weekends have two options:

- 1. Park in a hospital lot or garage listed above
- 2. Apply for a courtesy parking permit to park in University lots after-hours and on weekends. This courtesy permit is valid in 'A', 'C', 'Z', and Motorcycle spaces, as well as the visitor spaces in Roth Way Garage. The courtesy after-hours and weekend parking permit is valid between 4:01pm 5:59am Monday Friday, and all day on Saturday and Sunday. Please apply using the Stanford University virtual parking permit system.

East Bay Shuttle Options For Staff Crossing the Bay Every Day



Don't want to pay the toll every day? You have options!

Staff who live in the East Bay and travel to the Stanford Medicine Main Campus have a variety of **free** options to skip the toll and commute in style.

- AC Transit Line U & Marguerite Line AE-F
 - The Marguerite Line AE-F supplements the AC Transit Line U transbay service. Grab a ride from the Fremont BART station, Park & Ride at Wells Fargo, or Ardenwood Park & Ride, and enjoy a direct connection to the main Stanford Medicine campus, with drop offs on Quarry Road, Roth Way, and Palm Drive. Line AE-F is free to all riders, and AC Transit Line U is free with your hospital ID.
- <u>Dumbarton Express</u>
 - The Dumbarton Express provides direct bus service from the East Bay to the peninsula. Stops at Ardenwood Park & Ride in the East Bay, and at Roth Way Garage on the Main Stanford Campus. Eligible employees ride for free with a Stanford Medicine-provided Clipper Card
- Marguerite Line EB

- The East Bay Express (EB) travels from the Fremont & Union City
 BART Stations and Ardenwood Park & Ride directly to the Stanford
 Campus, with stops along Quarry Road. Line EB is free to all riders.
- Fircrest Park & Ride and Shuttle
 - The Stanford Medicine Fircrest Park & Ride is a free option provided to Stanford Medicine staff. Apply for a free Fircrest Park & Ride permit today, and enjoy a quick shuttle ride to the Ardenwood Park & Ride, where you can connect with the AC Transit Line U, Marguerite Line AE-F, or Dumbarton Express.

Parking Shuttles from Hoover to Hospitals

Parked at Hoover? Hospital Transportation Services has You Covered



Staff who need to travel between Hoover Pavilion and the main Hospitals can choose from a variety of **free** shuttle options.

- Hospital Direct (HD)
 - The HD shuttle provides all-day service between Hoover Pavilion,
 Searsville Lot, 500 Pasteur Transportation Lounge, and Lucile

Packard Children's Hospital.

Medical Center (MC)

 The MC shuttle travels between the Palo Alto Transit Center, Hoover Pavilion, 500 Pasteur Transportation Lounge, and Lucile Packard Children's Hospital

• Line X

 Line X runs to and from the Palo Alto Transit Center by way of Hoover Pavilion and Quarry Extension. Stops along Quarry Road and Quarry Road Extension are a great option for hospital staff looking to travel from Hoover Pavilion to Lucile Packard Children's Hospital or 300 Pasteur.

Line Y

Line Y runs to and from the Palo Alto Transit Center by way
of Quarry Extension and Hoover Pavilion. Stops along Quarry Road
and Quarry Road Extension are a great option for hospital staff
looking to travel from Lucile Packard Children's Hospital or 300
Pasteur to Hoover Pavilion.

• SRI Shuttle

 Have you noticed the new shuttle in town? The SRI shuttle connects the SRI Park & Ride Lot in Menlo Park with Lucile Packard Children's Hospital and 500 Pasteur Transportation Lounge, serving Hoover Pavilion along the way.

• Evening Parking Shuttle

- Working nights? The Evening Parking Shuttle is an on-demand service between 9:00pm-4:00am Monday - Friday. Simply call to request the shuttle for a ride directly to your parking destination.
- Starting early? From 4:00am-5:00am, the Evening Parking Shuttle runs every 15 minutes from Hoover Pavilion Garage to Lucile Packard Children's Hospital and 500 Pasteur Transportation Lounge

Health and Safety

To promote the health and safety of riders, Hospital Transportation Services has implemented cleaning and safety protocols on all shuttles.

- Masks required at all times while riding no eating or drinking allowed
- Hand Sanitizer dispensers are installed on shuttles
- Vehicles are sanitized routinely
- Signs are posted on all vehicles to remind riders of these policies
